The Steadman Bodden House is a traditional Caymanian home that represents a common style of house once found throughout the Cayman Islands and the Western Caribbean. Built in George Town around 1860, the house was carefully moved to Pedro St. James in 1995 to help preserve an important part of Cayman's heritage.

The house was built using a method called wattle and daub. The walls were made by weaving thin strips of wood, called wattle, between sturdy wooden posts. The woven walls were then covered with a limestone plaster mixture known as daub, creating strong and durable walls.
